How West Georgia Technical College Takes Campus Safety Seriously

The Challenge

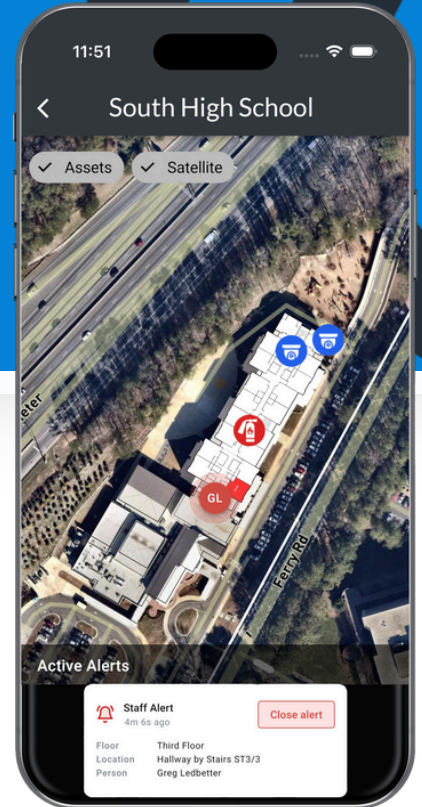
- WGTC faces unique safety challenges due to its mix of modern and historic buildings, including a WWII-era facility with lead-lined roofs, and its expansive rural campus with dispersed structures.
- Unlike urban campuses, WGTC must closely monitor outdoor areas and building exteriors across a wide geographic footprint, complicating communication and emergency response.

The Solution

- WGTC implemented a multi-layered safety strategy combining CrisisAlert wearable panic buttons, an active police presence, a dedicated safety team, frequent safety meetings, an extensive camera system, and visitor management protocols.

The Results

- Initial skepticism toward CrisisAlert among staff diminished after its effectiveness was proven during real-time emergencies and unplanned tests.
- CrisisAlert has been vital during medical emergencies, including one where a staff member used the wearable to request help before losing consciousness in her office.
